




Competition of uses?

- Bioenergy = new recent possible use of the biomass resource
- Raw material use for biomass in Europe: residues and low quality roundwood
- Competition = more value to co-products
- In some cases, there can be a competition between different uses
- Cost of raw material for bioenergy = more than 50% of total biomass production costs.
- Competition of uses debate focused on the responsibility of the bioenergy sector. The wood products markets are more complex

Examples of Cost Structures in Different Forest Industry Sectors

Several concepts mixed in one debate?

Support schemes, resource efficiency, cascade principle: all mixed

Support schemes to bioenergy = impact on competition?

- •Support schemes objective = reach EU climate and energy goals including reducing GHG emissions and decreasing EU fossil energy dependence (NB: subsidies to fossil fuels still in place)
- •A large part of biomass uses do not receive incentives
- •For each type of biomass, there is not always several uses
- •AEBIOM open to discussions on support schemes

Resource efficiency

- •Must be supported for all types of resources
- •Bioenergy is part of the bio based economy and can be a solution to the efficient use of the bio resource
- Definition on cascading? An EU law with cascade as a binding principle is not the solution.
