




Cities:



Key challenges



- 85% of energy in Poland is generated from fossil fuels (45% coal, 17% natural gas)
- lack of data
- -0.7% reductions of GHG emissions in Poland since 2005
- insufficient resources
- lack of experts at the local level
- lack of a coherent strategy for energy transition at the national level

Polish cities embrace challenges and don't give up on ambition



- 4.1% for such a share of domestic electricity generation by prosumer installations (1.2 million installations)
- Increase of local investment in RES
- Cities are saving energy
- According to the More in Common survey, the direction in which the Polish energy sector should go is subject to social consensus. Support for accelerating investment in renewable energy sources is declared by more than 90% of Poles.
